Hammondsport UMW had a challenging summer with involvement in many activities, starting with the Community VBS held during the last week in June. All of our area churches participate and their pastors were also helping on a daily basis. We had 65 children enrolled and 37 teens helped in various capacities. We raised \$500 for the "Imagine No More Malaria" campaign and also collected food items for the local food pantry. In preparation for this event, Onalee Clark and Diane Albright held "Safe Sanctuary" training for 52 individuals, who included all of our Sunday School and VBS adult volunteers. A chicken BBQ was held in July, sponsored by the church Trustees. Several UMW members helped out. We raised over \$1,400 for church building maintenance and upgrades. # Neighborhood Service's Organization (NSO) provides much needed dental care to the underserved in Oklahoma Citv.

40 young people gathered for Thanksgiving dinner hosted by NSO, a UMW supported national mission institution serving at-risk and homeless of Oklahoma City. When one young man was questioned as to why he was only eating mashed potatoes, he responded, "My teeth really hurt!" After several visits to the dental clinic, he had all his teeth extracted with dentures made. He had been homeless since turning 18 when he aged out of foster care! (*Response-* May pp. 22-23)

#### The Status of Women

Carol Burnett attended the 59<sup>th</sup> UN Commission of the Status of Women. She is executive director of Moore Community House in Biloxi, Mississippi, a UMW related national mission institution, where she works to ensure women's economic security. Moore Community House provides affordable, quality childcare and job training leading to higher paid jobs in the construction industry. Her role at the conference was to share how these services make differences in lives of low income women and their children; to make connections with and to learn from other women around the world doing similar work. "While it was discouraging to see how slow and small our progress is toward accomplishing our goals, it is inspirational to see so many women working together inside and out of their governments and in communities of all types around the globe to achieve equality for women!" 






How many in 2015?


