LEADERSHIP TRAINING DEVELOPMENT EVENT -APRIL 15TH -10AM-NOON AT FIRST ONEONTA UMC **Aaron Bouwens on the district**

One of the newest projects being worked on for the Annual Conference is development of a Leadership Academy. Over the next couple of months there will be the development of a process by which we can increase the leadership capacity of our leaders. Before we developed the process however, it was determined that we should have core competencies that we build our process around. The competencies come in two varieties, technical and adaptive. The technical are the actions of ministry, leading worship, developing ministry plans, etc.... The Adaptive are more environmental or culture developing in nature, these have also been called meta-

functions of leadership. The adaptive competencies move well beyond just the actions, and get to understandings.

Here is where we can use your help. It does us no good to develop competencies if they do not make sense or make sense to those we are looking to walk with. Therefore, you are invited to join us at First Oneonta UMC – in Embury Room on April 15, 2015 from 10am to noon for conversation about leadership competencies. Please R.S.V.P. The format of our time together will be very conversational. 15-20 minutes will be spent presenting the work that has already been done. The remainder of our time will be spent listening and gaining feedback

CONGREGATION-BASED CPE CLASS IN BINGHAMTON, NY
AUGUST TO DECEMBER 2015

Congregation-Based Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) teaches pastoral care, pastoral leadership, and systems theory for clergy, seminarians, and lay ministers in the church. It is designed for experienced pastors, lay workers, and seminarians new to pastoral work. Clergy and lay ministers strengthen pastoral and leadership skills, address tension and conflict in the church, and work on their own personal growth in ministry. The program focuses on in depth systemic change and leadership development that reduces pastoral and congregational anxiety and addresses long-term issues in the church.

CPE Class Location – Binghamton, NY – Broome County Council of Churches
Dates – August to December 2015 – Two days every other week.

Congregation-Based CPE includes three creative components:

- Focus on pastoral and leadership issues and use of self in ministry.

Consultation on ministry and theological reflection using the case study CPE format.
Application of Bowen Family Systems Theory to congregational life.

Participants use their current experience in the congregation and other settings as the "clinical material" for learning in the small group process of five to eight students under supervision. The program explores the dynamics of the congregation using the systems theory developed by Dr. Murray Bowen and applied to church leadership by Dr. Edwin Friedman. Participants explore how their position in their family of origin impacts their use of self in ministry, and they work to manage anxiety and maximize strengths.

The CPE program curriculum includes (1) case material from congregational ministry, (2) family of origin work, (3) presentations and discussions on systems theory, theology, and pastoral ministry, and (4) consultation with the supervisor and group reflection time designed to strengthen ministry. Announcement: Opportunity to support General Church funds

Although the deadline for getting 2014 Ministry Share payments to the Conference Office has passed, Churches that have not paid 100% of their Ministry Share benevolence still have an opportunity to contribute to General Church funds, including the Black College Fund, the Africa University fund, and many more through shared giving. Because the Conference deadline to make payments to General Church funds is not until Jan. 23, 2015, the Conference Treasurer's Office has decided to accept additional payments on a case-by-case basis that will go into the pool supporting the ministries of The United Methodist Church.

In 2013 the Upper New York Conference was only able to contribute 56% of their General Church funds. This year the hope is to contribute at least 61%.
