NEW – Equitable Compensation Application for January-June 2016 available

The Commission on Equitable Compensation has issued guidelines and an application form for salary grants to local churches for the period Jan. 1 to June 30, 2016. Salary grants are available only to churches with a pastor under full time appointment.

To apply for salary assistance from the Equitable Compensation Fund, applicants should review the policies and procedures in the application document for guidance, and then complete the application according to the directions provided by the <u>Oct. 9, 2015</u> deadline.

Please note the following documents must be submitted with your application to be considered complete:

Copy of the Clergy Compensation Form for all churches the UNY clergy person currently serves Copy of church's most recent budget (if serving more than one church, include budgets from all) Ezra Church Summary 6-Part Graphic Report

Attach the application, along with the above documents, to an email or print them to mail to your District Superintendent for receipt by Oct. 9.

NOTE: The application is set up as a template. To add text, tab through the document to each box and start typing. Once completed, save the document to your computer as "[your church name] Jan 2016." The Commission anticipates notifying churches of its determination by mid-November. <u>Click the link</u> for the application form.

What is UMVIM? UM Volunteers in Mission (VIM) exists to promote, encourage, and enable Christians to exemplify "Christian Love in Action" through short-term mission service in the United States and abroad. It provides opportunities for service by developing and nurturing relationships with domestic and international leaders.

Who should attend team leader training? Anyone interested in learning more about being a VIM team leader or if you want to be a better team member! Team Leader Training is required for all first time UMVIM team leaders, but all interested persons are welcome to attend.

What will be covered in the training? Topics will include picking a project, team roles, choosing members, making a budget, fundraising, necessary forms, youth teams, safe sanctuaries, team health and safety, telling the story, cultural considerations, spiritual development, and international and medical teams.

Nicaragua 2016

A VIM team will be going to Nicaragua in 2016. Tentative dates are March 3—17. The team will be working with Dr. Belinda Forbes, UM missionary dentist. Belinda works with Accion Medica Cristiana (Christian Medical Action/ AMC), an agency that works with some of the poorest people in Nicaragua, the second poorest country in our hemisphere. The team will probably do health related work but not direct medical care. Work might include assisting with dental care, health education, construction, etc. AMC will look at the team's skills and the community's needs to determine the work and the location. It is expected that the team will go to the northeastern region, the RACCN, which is regarded as the poorest area of Nicaragua.

The team is being sponsored by First UMC, Schenectady, which has a covenant relationship with Dr. Forbes. Anticipated cost will be \$2000-2500. Team leader is Cindy Schulte.
